
RMITCreds

MELBOURNE

Get set for an action-packed three day orientation program full of events and activities that will introduce you to the academic and social side of campus life. You'll meet loads of new friends, get a taste of Australian culture and most importantly - have a lot of fun!

DAY 1 Discover RMIT

Orientation Day

Orientation day formally marks the beginning of semester for new students, and is loaded with useful information about the facilities and services. The event is usually organised one week prior to the start of semester. It is important you attend orientation and the other welcome events in order to meet other students, and become well-equipped for your experience at RMIT Vietnam.

Orientation Day includes:

- ◆ Collect your student ID card and orientation kit;
- ◆ Learn about useful resources and support services (*housing, banking, insurance, etc.*);
- ◆ Learn about safety; local community and Vietnamese culture;
- ◆ Meet staff and fellow students from your program;
- ◆ Meet the volunteer buddy team;
- ◆ Meet new friends from different countries and have an opportunity to find housemates;
- ◆ Explore RMIT online and on-campus resources (*RMIT email, Student Intranet, Canvas, Online Enrolment System, Library, SafeZone, etc.*)

Buddy Program

To ensure you have the best experience at RMIT Vietnam, we offer a wide range of support services and activities. RMIT Vietnam encourages you to get involved and be part of our community along with local Vietnamese students.

The Buddies at RMIT Vietnam will support you during your stay in Vietnam, from the time you depart your home country until the end of the semester.

A Buddy is a current volunteer student who is well equipped with necessary skills and knowledge to help you with your transition to RMIT and living in Vietnam.

The Buddy team help to organise many activities for international students including city tours, cooking classes, welcome dinner, Vietnamese classes and culture sharing.

Cost of living

To help you understand the costs of relocating to Melbourne, we have developed a helpful student budget guideline for you.

The following estimates are based on a single student living in shared accommodation.

Weekly expenses:

Item	Cost per week
Rent (shared)	AU\$175 - \$350
Electricity water & gas	AU\$35 - \$140
Food	AU\$80 - \$150
Phone and internet	AU\$20 - \$55
Public transport	Up to \$55
Entertainment	AU\$80 - \$150
Estimated weekly total	AU\$445 - \$1,345

On campus

Living on campus is a great way to make friends and enjoy a safe and relaxing living environment. You can live in a single studio with an ensuite bathroom, or share with others in either a three or five bedroom apartment.

Off campus

Students who want to live off campus will need to arrange their own accommodation, but the RMIT International Unit is more than happy to give you advice and assistance so you can find the right housing to suit you.

Cost of living

Vietnam is an affordable place to live and the cost of rent, food, transport and utilities is a fraction of what you'd pay in most countries.

The following estimates are based on a single student living in shared accommodation.

Weekly expenses:

Food	AU\$25 - \$50

Public transport	Up to \$0.50 per km

Check you meet the entry requirements

You must:

- have completed at least one full year of studies at your home institution.
- have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.5 out of 4 or 60% average (or equivalent).
- meet RMIT's English language requirements <http://bit.ly/englishrequirement>
- be 18 years of age or over at time of application.


